



2024 POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS REPORTING

In 2024, Pentair made no Political Contributions. As defined in Pentair's Political Contributions Policy, such contributions generally include any corporate spending in the form of a gift, loan, advance or deposit of money to political candidates, political parties, organizations primarily engaged in political activities and ballot initiative organizations.

Three U.S.-based trade associations or other tax-exempt organizations to which Pentair made a payment of \$50,000 or more in 2024 reported to Pentair that some portion of that payment was used for political activity purposes.

The Minnesota Business Partnership (MNBP) used a portion (\$43,590) of their funds for lobbying activities. MNBP is a not-for-profit organization whose purpose is to maintain a high quality of life for all Minnesotans by ensuring that the state's economy remains strong and globally competitive.

The National Association of Manufacturers (NAM) used a portion (\$14,346) of their funds for lobbying activities. NAM is the nation's largest industrial trade association and a leading advocate for a policy agenda that promotes job creation in the manufacturing sector.

The Association of Pool & Spa Professionals (APSP) used a portion (\$5,250) of their funds for lobbying activities. APSP is the world's oldest and largest association representing swimming pool, spa, and hot tub manufacturers, manufacturers' agents, builders, designers, distributors, suppliers, installers, retailers, and service technicians. Dedicated to the growth and development of its members' businesses and to promoting the enjoyment and safety of pools and spas, APSP offers a range of services, from professional development to advancing key legislation and regulation at all levels, to consumer outreach and public safety.
